SBHCs are medical clinics physical, behavioral, and preventative health

A SBHC at Mountain View High will allow students to access healthcare services during the day while at school and will help reduce barriers to access such as cost, transportation and inconvenience.

Almost 30% of all students attending Mountain View High School qualify for the reduced lunch program and the Oregon Health Plan (Medicaid).

SBHCs emphasize prevention, early intervention and

risk reduction. SBHC providers counsel students on healthy habits and preventing injury, violence and other threats.

SBHCs are an ideal, convenient location for medical and mental health staff to collaboratively address students' physical and mental health needs—leading to greater success in school and life.

Mountain View School-Based Health Center Details

- The Mountain View SBHC will be located on the campus of Mountain View High School at 2755 NE 27th St., Bend, OR, 97701.
- The SBHC will be housed in a 28' wide x 64' long modular medical office structure manufactured by Modern Building Systems of Aumsville, OR.
- The modular unit will travel by truck transport to Bend in two halves. The unit will be assembled on site.
- **Staffing:** The SBHC will be staffed with a Pediatric Primary Care Provider, Medical Assistant, Receptionist, Behavioral Health Consultant and a Behavioral Specialist.
- Hours: The SBHC will open to patients on Monday, May 1. General hours moving forward will be Tuesday-Friday, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.
- Access: Open to anyone in the community up to age 18. Patients do not need to be enrolled at the school to access services. Health insurance is not required. Patients can have healthcare established elsewhere.
 People can visit a SBHC without their legal guardian present if: they are 14+ for behavioral health services; or 15+ for medical services.
- **Paying for Care:** SBHC's bill insurance just like a regular clinic but no child will be turned away if they are unable to pay for services or do not have insurance. Mosaic also accepts most private or commercial insurance and all local OHP (Medicaid). They offer reduced rates based on a sliding scale to all established patients (participation is income dependent and an application is required).

Project Expenses: Total \$700,000

- \$500,000 Hard costs: clinic construction
- \$150,000 Soft costs: Architect and engineering, permits and fees
- \$50,000 Workstations, office furniture, networking, computers, equipment, medical supplies, etc.

• Project Funding:

- \$500,000 Bend-La Pine Schools
- \$182,000 Community Donations (\$5,000 away from meeting fundraising goal; reach out to donate@ mosaicmedical.org to participate)
- \$18,000 Mosaic internal funds
