KINDER) 7 8 9 10 On May 21, 2024, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission 11 (Commission) issued a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing to John S. Kinder (Kinder), in 12 which the Commission charged him with Gross Neglect of Duty and /or Gross Unfitness. 13 The Notice was sent via U.S. First Class Mail and U.S. Certified Mail Receipt 9589 0710 5270 0408 4715 91 to the address on file with the Commission. The Notice designated 14 15 the Commission file as the record for purposes of proving a prima facie case. The 16 Certified Mail receipt was returned to the Commission signed. The regular first-class 17 mail was not returned to the Commission and assumed delivered. The Notice of 18 Opportunity of Hearing, dated May 21, 2024, and signed by Melissa Goff, Interim 19 Executive Director, stated: 20 "IF A REQUEST FOR HEARING IS NOT RECEIVED WITHIN THIS 21-DAY 21 PERIOD, YOUR RIGHT TO A HEARING SHALL BE CONSIDERED WAIVED 22 UNLESS YOUR FAILURE TO REQUEST A HEARING WAS BEYOND YOUR 23 REASONABLE CONTROL. IF YOU DO NOT REQUEST A HEARING, 24 WITHDRAW YOUR REQUEST FOR HEARING, OR IF YOU FAIL TO APPEAR 25 AT A HEARING, OR NOTIFY THE COMMISSION THAT YOU WILL NOT 26 APPEAR AT HEARING, THE COMMISSION WILL ADOPT AN ORDER OF 27 DEFAULT WHICH MAY INCLUDE THE REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF YOUR LICENSE OR OTHER DISCIPLINE." 28 29 30 On May 28, 2024, the Commission received a domestic return receipt for the 31 certified Notice of Opportunity for Hearing document listed above. This document was 32 returned and signed by the educator, Kinder, as received. To date, the Commission has not received any further contact from Kinder and therefore, finds Kinder to be in default 33 34 and enters the following findings of fact, conclusions of law, and final order, based on 35 the files and records of the Commission concerning this matter. 36 37

The Commission has licensed Kinder since December 7, 2007. Kinder currently
holds a Preliminary Teaching License, with an endorsement in Art (PK-12) valid
from August 9, 2022, through August 16, 2025. During all relevant times, Kinder
was employed by the Bend-La Pine School District (BLSD).

2. On June 29, 2023, the Commission received a School District Misconduct Report from the BLSD indicating Kinder may have committed acts which constitute gross neglect of duty and / or gross unfitness. The report alleged Kinder offered a fifteen-year-old BLSD student marijuana and mushrooms, that Kinder was under the influence of an intoxicant (alcohol) at school, that Kinder left students unattended at school, and that Kinder disregarded a directive to not communicate with students while under investigation.

3. According to BLSD records, on February 2, 2023, while skiing at Hoodoo Ski Area, Kinder identified himself as a BLSD pottery instructor to a fifteen-year-old male BLSD student and offered the student a "hit" of marijuana from a vape pen and some hallucinogenic mushrooms.

4. Investigation found that on or around February 10, 2023, Kinder was late to work arriving just before class began at 8:45 AM. Kinder was observed to have smelled of alcohol, had slurred speech, and was oversharing about drinking the previous night and shared that he was "an alcoholic". It was reported Kinder told a coworker that he was out "drinking" until 1:00 AM the night prior. At around 9:30 AM Summit High School Principal, Michael McDonald, contacted Kinder in his classroom and observed Kinder having difficulty forming words. Additionally, McDonald observed that Kinder smelled of alcohol. McDonald left to contact the school resource police officer at which point Kinder told the class a substitute teacher was enroute at 9:30 AM and then left his classroom unattended. McDonald returned to find Kinder's classroom unattended by staff at around 10:00 AM. McDonald located Kinder at a nearby park and Kinder admitted to struggling with alcohol, and that Kinder left his class unattended. It was reported

Kinder refused to answer any other questions and refused to be transported to the hospital.

5. Investigation also found that on February 10, 2023, Kinder was advised of an ongoing BLSD investigation and was instructed to refrain from communicating with any students. In the following days, Kinder spoke to two to three (2-3) students in person about the incidents and text messaged an additional four to seven (4-7) students about the incidents. During the BLSD investigation, Kinder admitted to talking to at least one student and disobeying the directive given to him by McDonald on February 10, 2023.

6. Commission investigation additionally found that on November 9, 2023, Kinder was mailed Certified Mail and First-class Mail a letter requesting Kinder participate in a Commission interview. The First-class letter was not returned. The Certified Mail letter was returned to Commission staff on December 11, 2023, after it was unclaimed. Commission staff had previously sent Kinder a notice of investigation in July 2023, (to the same address) and Kinder completed the Certified Mail return receipt in early August 2023. On December 18, 2023, Commission staff attempted to contact Kinder via email with the same letters. To date, the Commission has not received a response from Kinder to indicate cooperation with investigation.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

By engaging in the above conduct in paragraph three (3), Kinder engaged in gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0020(2)(d) (Skill in the supervision of students); 584-020-0030((2)(b)(Skill in communicating with administrators, students, staff, parents, and other patrons); and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(o) as incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(1)(D) (Honoring appropriate adult boundaries with students in conduct and conversation at all times).

The conduct described above in paragraph four (4) constitutes gross neglect of

duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations) OAR 584-020-0020(2)(d) (Skill in the supervision of students), and OAR 584-020-0025(1)(a) (Establishing and maintaining classroom management that is conducive to learning).; and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(g) (Appearing on duty or at any district-sponsored activity while under the influence of alcohol or any controlled substance).

By engaging in the above conduct in paragraph five (5), Kinder engaged in gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations), 584-020-0030((2)(b)(Skill in communicating with administrators, students, staff, parents, and other patrons); and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(o) as in incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(1)(D) (Honoring appropriate adult boundaries with students in conduct and conversation at all times).

The conduct described above in paragraph six (6) constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(p) (Subject to the exercise of any legal right or privilege, failure or refusal by an educator under investigation to respond to requests for information, to furnish documents or to participate in interviews with a Commission representative relating to a Commission investigation).

The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS 342.175.

26 FINAL ORDER

The Commission accepts Kinder's failure to cooperate with the Commission as not contesting this matter and the Commission will proceed with a Default Order and hereby revokes Kinder's teaching license with the condition that Kinder completes a Commission-approved Drug and Alcohol evaluation prior to consideration of any
